**ORDER**

The Debtor filed its chapter 11 petition on June 16, 2025. [ECF No. 1.] The Debtor did not file all required documents with the petition, so it was ordered to file the missing information within 14 days of the petition date. [ECF No. 5.]

On June 30, 2025, the day the documents were due, the Debtor filed a Motion to Extend Time to File Schedules and Other Documents. [ECF No. 56.] The Debtor explains that it has been unable to gather all the information necessary to comply and asks for an additional 14 days to file the outstanding schedules and documents. [*Id.*] The United States Trustee objects and argues that an extension through July 14 would not give parties sufficient time to review the documentation before the continued first day hearings on July 15, 2025, and first meeting of creditors scheduled for July 18, 2025. [ECF No. 67.]

The United States Trustee raises a valid concern. The Debtor has provided very little information to interested parties to date, although it is clear the Debtor must move quickly to carry out its plan to sell assets. [*See* ECF Nos. 13, 49.] The Debtor's representative did not appear for cross-examination at the first day hearings scheduled for June 26, 2025, despite submitting affidavits supporting the requested relief. The Debtor's representative also canceled the Initial Debtor Interview scheduled for July 1, 2025, less than an hour before the meeting with

the United States Trustee. The United States Trustee also has not received any of the bank statements or other documents promised by the Debtor's counsel at the first day hearings.

The missing schedules and documents are necessary for parties to understand the Debtor's operations and objective for seeking bankruptcy relief. But an extension through July 14 does not give the United States Trustee, other parties, and the Court sufficient time to review the information, particularly where the Debtor's representative has not appeared for the Initial Debtor Interview or provided the bank statements as promised by counsel.

Based on the foregoing, it is ORDERED the Debtor's Motion to Extend [ECF No. 56] is GRANTED IN PART. The Debtor shall file the outstanding schedules and other documents **on or before July 11, 2025**, or risk prompt dismissal or conversion of this proceeding.

It is further ORDERED that the hearing set on the Debtor's Motion to Extend scheduled for July 15, 2025, is STRICKEN from the docket.
